A RESOLUTION

SUPPORT OF ACS –CVS HEALTH TOBACCO-FREE CAMPUS GRANT

- 1 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society and CVS Health have launched the
2 Tobacco-Free Generation Campus Initiative;
- 3 WHEREAS, this initiative provides a grant opportunity for U.S. colleges and
4 universities to support education, advocacy, and cessation of
5 smoking with the goal of adopting a smoke-free or tobacco-free
6 campus policy;
- 7 WHEREAS, of the roughly 20 million college and university students in the
8 United States, more than 1 million are projected to die prematurely
9 from cigarette smoking;¹
- 10 WHEREAS, The University of Pittsburgh does not currently have a smoke-free
11 or tobacco-free campus policy and stands to benefit from these
12 resources; *now, therefore, be it*
- 13 RESOLVED, on this 7th day of February in the year 2017, the University of
14 Pittsburgh Student Government Board supports the application to
15 the American Cancer Society-CVS Health Tobacco-Free Generation
16 Campus Initiative; *and be it further*
- 17 RESOLVED, that The Student Government Board will share responsibility for
18 the implementation of this initiative and the associated grant, if it
19 is awarded to The University of Pittsburgh; *and be it finally*

20 RESOLVED, this resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption and
21 shall reflect the official position of the University of Pittsburgh
22 Student Government Board.

23 ADOPTED: this 7th day of February 2017 by a vote of 9 for, 0 against, and 0
24 abstentions.
